We work to bring in new and youthful members through our outreach events and activities.

- a. Hosted two youth gatherings and a youth camp, funded by a Korean non-profit organization. Guest speaker: Helena Norberg Hodge, founder and director of Local Futures: the International Society for Ecology and Culture
- b. Actively participated in an EDE in India

  - i. Hosted a workshop in Belipola (September 2015). Youth participants formed several subgroups and









are working on an ongoing basis on ecological and community projects, using a Facebook page they created to facilitate regular communication
